A naturally occurring psychedelic compound with promise as a psychiatric intervention for depression, PTSD, OCD, anorexia nervosa and addictions to alcohol, stimulants and tobacco.

## WHY HINDER RESEARCH INTO MENTAL HEALTH?

Significant decrease in depressive symptoms for up to 6 months (Carhart-Harris et al., 2016)

Significant decreases in anxiety and depression for 6.5 months (Ross et al., 2016)

80% smoking abstinence at 6 months (Johnson et al., 2014)

**6570** suicides in the UK in 2018.

- Psilocybin is currently more controlled than heroin. WHY?
- With the exception of Esketamine there have been no new treatments for depression in over 30 years.


